SUBJECT: Update on Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE)

Decennial Self-Study

The Middle States Self-Study Design Report serves as the template for the ten-year Self-Study that is required of all MSCHE-accredited institutions. The Design Report includes: 1) intended outcomes that have been developed to guide the efforts of the Self-Study working groups in alignment with Middle States standards; 2) the suggested profile of the evaluation team that will conduct the College's Self-Study visit in 2018, and 3) documents, processes, and procedures used by the working groups as evidence for meeting the criteria cited for each MSCHE standard.

The College's Self-Study Design Report was due and submitted to Middle States Vice Presidents Dr. Debra Klinman and Dr. Ellie Fogarty by the April 1<sup>st</sup> deadline. During the upcoming Self-Study Preparation visit, scheduled for Tuesday, April 19<sup>th</sup> with Middle States Vice President Dr. Ellie Fogarty, the College will receive feedback and suggestions on its plan design.

The current itinerary for this visit also includes several meetings between Dr. Fogarty and various constituent groups involved in the reaccreditation process, as well as a forum that is open to participation by all members of the college community. **The forum will be conducted on Tuesday, April 19<sup>th</sup> from 1:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m.**; it will originate from the Montauk Point Room on the Ammerman Campus and will be simulcast to the MD 105 Lecture Hall in the Health, Sports and Education Center on the Michael J. Grant Campus, and the Montaukett Learning Resource Center-Room 107/108 on the Eastern Campus. All faculty, staff and students are invited to participate in the open forum.

Across our College, four key groups are leading the Self-Study process. These groups are: the Self-Study Steering Committee, which represents a cross-section of faculty, staff and administrators from all three campuses and is providing overall guidance during the Self-Study process; seven standards committees (working committees); as well as a Logistics Committee and a Writing Committee.
